MOREHEAD STATE STUDENT AWARDED 2019 TOYOTA

Lexington – A Morehead State University student is the lucky winner of Kentucky Blood Center's summer grand prize and will be awarded her 2019 Toyota Tacoma this week. Anny Smith, a junior majoring in International Studies, donated blood at a KBC drive on campus in August.

The Tacoma will be presented to Smith on Tuesday, September 24 at Noon, at the ADUC Plaza on Morehead State's campus.

"I donate blood because it is the right thing to do," Smith said. "I make enough blood to share some, and the recipients need it very much. I'm more than ecstatic to have won the truck! I feel very blessed and fortunate. I am very thankful to the Kentucky Blood Center for giving me this amazing opportunity. I hope this encourages others to donate as well."

Smith has donated blood many times in her hometown of Middletown, Ohio, but the August donation on her college campus was her first with Kentucky Blood Center. In addition to the satisfaction of saving up to three lives with her donation, Smith's donation also won her the summer's grand prize.
